The Problem

Students cannot reach the higher rungs. (The upper grade Common Core Standards) because they are missing the bottom rungs of the ladder. They have not learned the basic skills of reading and writing. They cannot read their 4th-8th grade subject matter books.

The Solution

Give them the missing rungs by teaching them the basic skills of reading, writing and spelling. When they learn the simple code of the English language they will be able to read every word they speak, every word they understand and they will be able to learn new things. When they are able to read their grade level books, they will be able to accomplish the Common Core Standards.


Who Needs the solution?

Teachers who need to remediate students.
Teachers of 1st through 3rd grade.
Parents who have a child who can't read.
Students who can't read at grade level.
What resources will they use?

Students will use the FUNdamentals, research-based intensive, systematic, multisensory, phonics program, to learn the basic code of the English language.

What activities will they complete?

They will learn to read and write using the simple alphabetic code of the English language introduced in a logical, systematic way. As they progress from simplest to most complex using decodable text, they will never have a word, sentence or story with a sound they have not yet learned. They will use songs, games and exercises to practice the 26 letters - 44 sounds - 70 spellings of the code.



What specific measurable short-term outcomes will students achieve?

What will the longer- impact be? Increasing the number of students who can read and write at grade level will create more: Success in school leading to more high school graduates, lifelong learners, and career and college ready students.
